Headteacher Update:

Dear Parents & Carers

I write to you at the end of the second week of the academic year and I am pleased to report that the high standards we saw in terms of uniform, behaviour and engagement amongst our students has continued. We have another record number of Aspire points being awarded across the Aspire framework. This week I met with some of those students who, at the end of last academic year, had received 500 Aspire points and so to recognise this huge milestone were presented with a Headteachers Award. The second round of presentations for the Headteachers Award will take place next week. This is a fantastic achievement, these students have throughout the year consistently met all expectations in and out of the classroom and have demonstrated those character virtues and learner skills at every opportunity. These students and their families should be extremely proud of this huge achievement.

The extra curricular activities have commenced this week and again, we have seen a record number of students who have been attending the clubs. There are still however a number of students that have not signed up to a club. We would really like to see everyone involved in at least one type of extra curricular activity. If there is no club that is of interest to your child then please encourage them to tell their form tutor and we will endeavour to make this happen within reason. I would like to finish by discussing attendance at school. As you will be well aware, school attendance is imperative. There is a direct link between school attendance and progress. Simply put, if students are not in lessons then they are missing a vital key component of knowledge for that subject leaving a gap in their knowledge. When those gaps in knowledge occur students will struggle to complete assessments etc and so quickly fall behind. Students who miss school are also more likely to struggle socially. It is important that your child understands fully the importance of attending school. Our attendance team is on hand to support any concerns you might have around your child's attendance. If your child is absent from school then please make sure that this is reported the morning of the absence. To further support this we are launching our new parent app called "studybugs" which is a new secure way to record your child's absence due to illness. Students can download the app onto their iPads and usernames and passwords are available from their maths teachers.

If your school has decided to share homework with pupils, you will see the Homework tab in your account.


Selecting this tab will display a list of the homework tasks which you have been given.
