#### **Headteacher Update:**

**Dear Parents & Carers** 

This week has been a real busy week as we rapidly approach the end of the school term. Firstly, I would like to thank you for the feedback I have received around the Parent Bulletin. In light of the feedback we will continue to send the Parent Bulletin on a weekly basis and the Safeguarding Parent Bulletin on a fortnightly basis.

We are now into our third week of trialling the move of Year 7 and 8 at break time to the hall with their own serving point and toilets. We have also increased break time by 5 minutes by removing the movement time at the beginning of the day. We have asked for feedback from the students on how they feel that this is working after their concerns and the response has been overwhelmingly positive therefore, we will continue to use the hall and outside quad area as the Year 7 and 8 social area at break time.

I require your support with a matter in school which is mainly affecting the male members of the school population. We have sadly experienced 5 separate episodes of vandalism in our main canteen toilets. This has resulted in expensive repairs and disruption whilst the repairs are taking place. It is also using a range of resources for us to investigate who the culprit(s) are. I must stress that this is limited to the involvement of a minority of students in school who are taking advantage of the fact that we as a school, have chosen not to lock our school toilets during lesson times, despite nationally, this being the approach. Whilst I would like to continue to keep these open during lesson times and not restrict the use of the toilets to break, lunch and movement times. If the vandalism does continue then I will be faced with no other option than to do this. Can I ask that you speak with the students and remind them of the importance of being responsible students and respecting the school property. We will continue to monitor the situation and I will write to you next week with whether or not the situation has improved.

To finish this week I would like to confirm the arrangements for the last day of term which is Friday 31st March. The last day of term for Easter finishes at 3pm and students will be expected to remain in school all day in full uniform. Year group celebration assemblies will take place during that day.

**Sports fixtures:** Year 7 and 8 girls are to play at home on Wednesday starting at 3.30pm against Perton Middle School. GOOD LUCK!


