Maths - Black History Month Mathematician - House competition

Over the last two weeks students have been creating posters celebrating the achievements on black mathematicians for the maths house competition.

Here a couple of our favourites so far:

Marjorie Lee Browne

Marjorie Lee Browne was a mathematics educator. She was one of the first African-American women to receive a PhD in mathematics.

While she taught, Browne also worked as a principal investigator, coordinator of the mathematics section, and lecturer for the Summer Institute for Secondary School Science and Mathematics Teachers.

Marjorie contributed to the Mathematical World by exploring the fundamental properties of shapes, and writing 3 pages of algebra and her new findings of the subject. These findings helped us with our understanding of algebra

Marjorie not only helped us with our understanding of algebra she also wrote a series of lecture notes for other teaches

Browne recognised the importance of computers, and in 1960 she wrote a grant proposal to IBM, winning \$60,000 to set up an electronic digital computer centre at NCCU, one of the first at a minority college.

I was stuck at the top of the building with no help and no way to live. There was no food, water or anything and the panic rose. So the only thought was to jump. Yes, jump off the building since there was no hope of survival. I stood on the edge of the tower before I jumped counting from 3 1... 2... and ... 3 I jumped and my life flashed before my eyes. It was until I had hit the floor I woke up in my bed again.

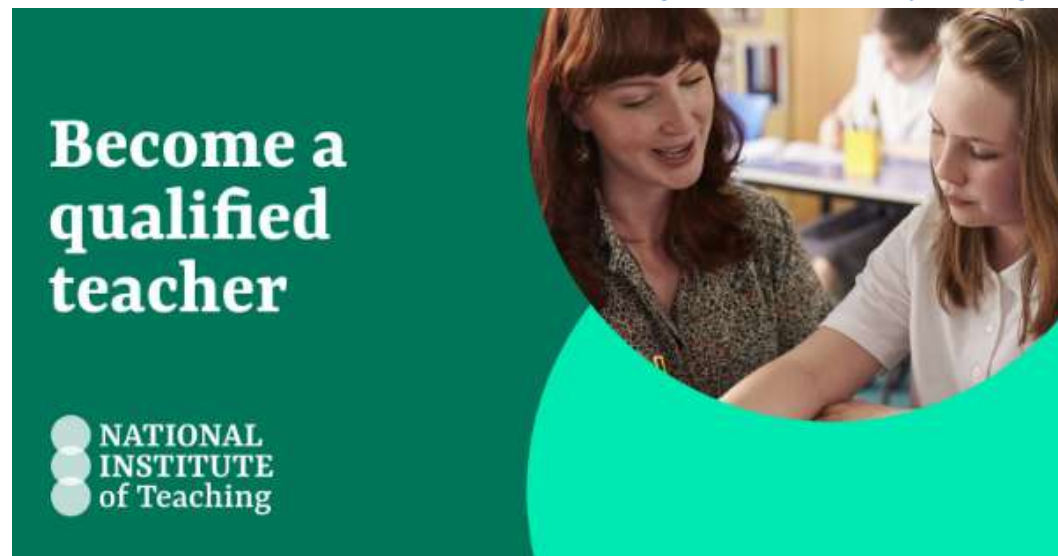

Initial Teacher Training at WAT

As part of WAT's partnership with the National Institute of Teaching as an Associate College, we are proud to announce that from September 2024 we will be offering our own teacher training provision. Applications for our Initial Teacher Training programme are now open for our September 2024 intake. Initial Teacher Training is a fully immersive school-centred programme, with school placements available in one of our 12 schools or at one of the six Dudley Academy Trust schools. Applicants will be able to choose their main placement school when applying and we will endeavour to do our best to place applicants in their first choice school. Our trainees are also mentored and have central training once a week.

All of our teacher training courses lead to QTS (Qualified Teacher Status), a PGCE (Post Graduate Certificate in Education) and 60 Master's Level credits.
