


Women in Maths trip

On Tuesday eight year 10 girls went to Keele University to attend the Women in Maths event which was organised by the AMSP.

In the morning the girls took part in some work experience where they helped decide where the CACI's marketing department should advertise their sunglasses launch event. They then learnt about how Florence Nightingale, who was a statistician as well as a nurse, used her statistical background to cut death rates during the Crimean war. The girls also got to learn about the mathematician and artist Mona Chalobi who turns data into illustrations. In the afternoon the girls got a chance to listen to some women in industry and how they use maths in their jobs.

After lunch was the most exciting event - Dr Jaclyn Bell (one of twelve finalists to take part in BBC two's 'Astronauts: Do you have what it takes') gave an inspiring presentation where she spoke about 'How far can maths take you?' Dr Bell spoke about how maths can open many doors and encouraged everyone to always follow their dreams!
