### **Headteacher Update:**

Dear Parents & Carers

It has been a really exciting and productive week here at Great Wyrley Academy. I must start with a huge congratulations to all Year 11 students who have been sitting their final mock examinations. Students have approached this set of the exams with real focus and determination. Their behaviour and attitude has been exemplary. It is important that we now use those results to inform where the knowledge gaps are so that we maximise the remaining learning opportunities we have until the start of the summer examinations. I cannot stress enough how important attendance to school is during this period of time. Staff are ensuring that there are robust plans in place to plug those gaps but quite simply, that cannot be done if students have time off. We know that there is a direct link between student attendance and academic performance. So my plea is to help make sure that every single remaining lesson counts. High levels of resilience and responsibility are two of those character virtues which we really need to be demonstrating during these remaining weeks.

Yesterday was World Book Day and as a school we held a number of activities to mark this occasion. Firstly, we started with Year group assemblies looking at the importance of reading, the link between reading and exposure to words and exam success. We also looked at how reading can help to manage stress levels. As a surprise for the children on Thursday staff dressed up as their favourite character from a book and all week have been sharing through posters on their doors what they are reading and whether or not they would recommend it. At the start of each lesson on Thursday we also asked each staff member to bring to school one of their favourite books and read an extract from it to their students. This was really well received and generated some lovely conversations around why it was such a good read. Finally, in Years 7,8 and 9 we "dropped everything to read" at 12.20pm using our online reading library SORA or a book that students bought in from home. Student engagement was really high during the day and we thank them all for their active participation.

I will leave you now to look through the rest of the bulletin, I hope you have a lovely weekend.

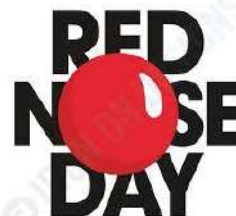


## Red Nose Day Friday 15th March:

### Roadmap to Exam Success

We have shared on the Year 11 Google Classroom a **Roadmap to Exam success**. In the document there are hints and tips to achieve exam success. With the mocks now completed, the next set of examinations our Year 11's face are their final Summer exams. Please encourage your child to access this resource.

## Roadmap to exam success

You have studied for many years to reach this summer's examinations. The last two years have been focused on the subjects that you need to go on to the next stage of your education. It is your job to make sure that you give yourself the best chance that you can of doing well.

**Stay calm, stay active, take control.**

### 1. Be organised - Space your revision

Make sure that you have a topic checklist for each subject. Use your topic checklist to make a **revision plan**. Here are some examples of how to **plan your revision** and relaxation time using the blank timetable. Share your plan with friends and family - you will be more likely to stick to it! Make sure that you study the topics that you find hardest first, not at the end of the day when you are tired. **Focus on tasks not time spent** on a session: decide what you want to have completed by the end of the revision period. Make the tasks specific and realistic.

### 2. Revise effectively - Self quizzing

The most effective way to put knowledge into your long term memory is to self quiz. The struggle that you feel when you are trying to remember a fact or technique builds connections in your brain and into your memory. Revision is active - always work with a pen and paper, look for key points, test yourself. Never just sit down and read for a set period.

**Ask yourself these 4 questions:**

1. What do I need to revise for each subject?
2. Which resources do I need to help me study?
3. Why are these resources helpful?
4. How will I use each resource?

**Recap and check what you know:**

- Look cover check
- Voice memo
- Flappy
- Online quizzing
- Flashcards and how to use them
- Blurt
- Practice questions
- PowerHour

### 3. Look after yourself

Build in time to **exercise and relax** - do things that you enjoy. Aim for 60 minutes of exercise every day - this could be as simple as going for a walk.

Sleep well - get a **routine in place** to help you sleep. 8-10 hours is recommended for teens (that's bed by 11pm on a school night).

Eat well - have a good breakfast.

Avoid burnout - Chunks of 30 minutes revision, 10 minutes break.

Avoid distractions - put your phone in another room whilst you revise.

**Yeungminds top tips** for staying well during exams.

### 4. In the exam

**Clear pencil case:** 2 black pens, 2 pencils, sharpener, highlighter, eraser, ruler, scientific calculator, protractor, compass.

Read each question carefully, highlight key words. Plan long answers.

If you are stuck on a question, move on and come back to it later, there will be other questions that you can answer.

Keep an eye on time - make sure that you have a go at all the questions that you can answer. It is usually easier to get the first 20% of the marks for any question than the final 20%. You can always polish an answer further but if there is no attempt made at a question the examiner can't give you any marks.

If your mind goes blank, no problem. **Take a moment**, breathe, think about something else for 60 seconds and then come back to the question.
