


Geography Threshold Concepts Building your understanding of these concepts will help to become a fantastic geographer.



Geographers study <u>place</u>, <u>space</u> and <u>scale</u>. They look at what makes places unique and different, but also how they may share similarities.



Geographers look for the natural and human <u>patterns</u> found on Earth and understand that these are not random.



Geographers understand <u>processes</u> are key to explaining what the Earth is like and why it is changing.



Geographers understand that there are <u>interactions</u> between people and places. Places and people are not separate but are <u>interdependent</u> on each other.



Geographers seek to understand the range of <u>perspectives/stakeholder views</u> that exist about issues that exist in a place; to help find the most appropriate solution.



Geographers recognise and understand that <u>sustainability</u> (social, economic and environmental) is now a key consideration when examining human activity on Earth.
